What Real Climate Leadership would Mean for the US: US Climate Justice Groups Call on US to do It's Fair Share

In Dubai, at COP28, climate justice activists were clear that the first Global Stocktake (GST) needed to turn the page on fossil fuels. Yet, the US and the rich countries have seen significant increases in their emissions in the last decade and clearly the Biden administration has failed to do so at home. We are increasingly seeing the US domestic policy in stark contrast to the public posturing of the US as a "climate champion" within the UNFCCC, especially as the US continues with new fossil fuel expansion plans. If the US wants to restore damaged trust with other countries and equitably achieve the Paris Agreement goal of limiting warming to 1.5C, it must demonstrate its commitment by including drastic emission cuts within its new Nationally Determined Contribution and end fossil fuel expansion.

Join us as members of <u>Global Campaign to Demand Climate Justice</u> (DCJ) and allies call out the US for obstructing forward progress in Bonn and share their demands of pausing new permits on LNG export terminals, which is the world's largest fossil expansion, to deliver climate finance, and cut emissions and military funding to move the money to the Global South as reparations for its climate debt.
